Derby / Whistlewood Forest School aims to ensure that the highest standards of care are maintained for all children at all times, and that parent's feel confident in staff members abilities. Children must be kept safe as outlined in our child protection and safeguarding policy. It is therefore vital that we have a transparent culture within our setting where everyone feels able to raise any concerns they may have.

If any staff member has concerns regarding the way children are being cared for or regarding the practice of another member of staff / volunteer, then they must report them to their immediate manager.

All concerns raised will be taken seriously and fully investigated.

If a staff member feels unable to discuss the matter with their manager, then they can make a referral to the Derby and Derbyshire Safeguarding Board by completing the <u>Derby and Derbyshire LADO form</u> on their website and can also find further information about local procedures at <u>Professional.Allegations@Derbyshire.gov.uk</u>
